### Greeting Raptors Families!

Let's welcome in November and remind ourselves that as fall comes to a close and winter is upon us, to have students prepared and dressed for the weather. Please take a moment to review these expectations with your student, and plan accordingly based on the forecast to be prepared for outdoor recess. In **Grades 4K-2**, jackets are required when the temperature is 59 degrees or less. In **Grades 3-5**, students must wear a jacket or a hoodie/fleece/flannel when the temperature is 33 degrees or above. When the temperature is 32 degrees or less, students must wear a jacket. All students who wish to play off of the blacktop (woodchip/grassy areas) will need to be wearing snow pants and boots. In **Grades 6-8**, students are offered an outdoor 'lunch recess' for 10 minutes to get fresh air. Middle schoolers will also be expected to wear a jacket or a hoodie/fleece/flannel when the temperature is 32 degrees or below.

Morning arrival time for students choosing breakfast is 7:25a at Door 5B. Middle School students enter at Doors 1, 14 & 15 at 7:27a. Elementary students (on playground 7:30a-7:45a) enter at Door 4 at 7:45a. Until the identified time, staff supervision is limited.

Fall also leads us into our first of two Parent/Guardian Teacher Conferences. Conferences. <u>Here are the details</u>. Conferences are 11/9, 11/14 and 11/22 (4K & Middle School only). We are strongly encouraging in-person conferences, but do offer a virtual option again this year.

Remind students to live the Raptor Way; Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe & Be Kind not only here at school but out in the community as well!



## Math Tip

A positive math identity can have large impacts on a student's ability to persevere through challenge. One way parents can help build a positive math identity is to help children change negative inner voices by harnessing the power of the word yet. When a child says, "I can't do this," re-voice the language to say, "You are ready to learn something new!" or "You can't do this yet. I'm here when you are willing to try again."

## Literacy Tip

Want to help your child be a better reader? One easy thing you can do at home is to include more complex vocabulary in your conversations. Don't shy away from longer words or specific vocabulary when talking to your child. Instead, use the more complex vocabulary and take the opportunity to explain to your child what these words mean. Hearing you use the vocabulary will help them to grow their own vocabularies and their understanding of the world around them, which will make them stronger readers. So don't shy away or simplify your vocabulary use it as an opportunity to teach your child!
